Purpose

The core functions of the Research Ethics Sub-Committee (RESC) are:

- i) to provide an opinion on applications for ethical approval submitted by academic staff where the applications are designated as medium or high risk;
- ii) to keep under review and make recommendations on the University's research ethics procedures and related guidance; and
- iii) to provide support and advice to academic staff on matters related to research ethics and integrity.

Terms of Reference

Authority

The Research Ethics Sub-Committee shall have delegated authority from the Research and Enterprise Committee to:

1. Provide an opinion (favourable or otherwise) on applications for ethical approval submitted by academic staff across the University, where the applications are designated as medium or high risk.
2. Review at each termly meeting a list of all applications approved by RESC since the previous meeting and discuss any wider issues which have arisen.
3. Periodically undertake a review of low-risk projects led by staff which have been granted ethical approval by academic schools.
4. Keep under review and make recommendations to REC on the University's research ethics procedures and related guidance.
5. Engage collaboratively with academic schools, the Graduate School and the Research Governance and Compliance Sub-Committee, also reporting to REC,

to ensure that the processes governing research across the University are robust, aligned, based on best practice, and compliance-driven.

6. Raise awareness of research ethics and integrity amongst academic staff across the University.
